## Legionella risk assessment Does your hall have one?

A member hall brought this issue to our attention by asking if the Network knew of a firm competent to undertake a Legionella risk assessment as the firm that they had previously used was no longer available. We made some enquiries amongst our halls and this has shown differing practices and a need for a greater awareness of what is involved.



We found that where member halls are owned by local au-

thorities Legionella risk assessments and monitoring are arranged by the local authority. Where ownership is different, some management committees ensure that a risk assessment is conducted, and others may not have considered the issue.

We suggest that Trustees who do not have a risk assessment in place for their hall, look at the Health and Safety Executive website HSE -Legionnaires' disease - What you must do and the HSE Legionnaires Disease Approved Code of Practice and Guidance, (it's not long) and consider it in committee.

We are not experts in this topic but below is our understanding of the position and a list of specialists that member halls have used, that we have been told about, is overleaf.

Conducting a Legionella Risk Assessment (LRA) is a legal requirement under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974, and building managers have a duty of care to protect the people in their buildings from harm. An LRA should be conducted by a person who has the competence and authority to undertake physical and administrative checks. Engaging the right water hygiene specialist will help ensure compliance and you will receive practical advice on how to minimise the chance of someone in your building contracting potentially fatal Legionnaires disease.

#### Where can Legionella bacteria grow?

Legionella bacteria live in natural water sources, but they can also be found in artificial water systems such as hot and cold water systems, cooling towers, and spas. Given the right combination of environmental conditions, any natural or manmade water system has the potential to become a breeding ground for Legionella growth. The health risks associated with



Legionella bacteria are significantly heightened in areas where water is stored or recirculated and where breathable water droplets are possibly spread in the form of aerosols.

#### What conditions promote the growth of Legionella bacteria?

Temperatures between 20-45°C (77°F–113°F). Places where there is a ready source of nutrients (sludge, organic matter, algae, scale, rust, etc.) Bio-film on water surfaces. Poor water management and no training and awareness programmes.

#### What external factors can help Legionella bacteria grow?

Water stagnation. Water temperature. Changes in municipal water quality. Water temperature fluctuations.

Scale and sediment. pH fluctuations. Inadequate levels of disinfectant.

My job is a police officer working in a regional engagement team, I work alongside 3 colleagues and our geographical area is Cleveland, Durham, and Northumbria police force areas. The job we have is to develop and deliver ways to empower individuals and organisations into being more resilient against fraud and economic crime. 41% of all crime is fraud and the estimated cost to the UK economy is £219 Billion per year. Everyone is a victim of fraud. There is a scam out there for everyone and the more understanding we have about risk, the better equipped we are to spot those scams. A greater awareness of types of scams and an increased collective knowledge of fraud can protect us, our communities, and our region.

Our job is to arm you with that awareness, knowledge and understanding by communication through newsletters, bulletins, presentations, and workshops. We tailor our approach to your needs. We have designed a bespoke presentation/workshop for village hall volunteers/groups which you can request by contacting the Tees Valley Village Halls Network. We will then liaise with you directly, so the content is appropriate for you and your village hall.
